Our records indicate you are a non-state retiree covered under the Public Employees' Benefits Program (PEBP). A non-state retiree is defined as a retiree whose last employer is other than the State of Nevada (e.g., a city, a county, a school district, etc.).

Per Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) section 287.0205, retired non-state employees, as defined above, or the surviving spouse of such a retiree, may re-enroll in the health insurance coverage currently offered by their last employer. This opportunity occurs every even-numbered year. If you wish to explore the possibility of enrolling in retiree coverage through your last employer you must provide a written request to your last employer no later than January 31, 2018.

You may contact your last employer directly to learn more about the reinstatement late enrollment opportunity. PEBP cannot advise you of the plans or rates offered by another employer and cannot quote future PEBP rates that have not yet been determined.

Your PEBP retiree coverage and subsidy will not be affected and no action is required on your part unless you opt to enroll in your last employer's plan during the reinstatement late enrollment.

If you choose to enroll in your last employer's plan, you must also dis-enroll from PEBP coverage on or before the effective date of your new coverage. If you dis-enroll from PEBP, you will not be able to re-enroll in PEBP plans, programs, or services in the future.
